In an effort to reduce overpopulation and the unwanted pet population, the Texarkana Humane Society sponsors a low-cost spay/neuter program. The reduced cost spay/neuter certificates are available to anyone in the community.

Volunteers who agree to provide a foster home for our strays are provided with medical care for the animals. The Humane Society pays for all immunizations and spays or neuters the animal. Our goal is to place these animals in permanent homes with responsible, loving pet owners. All of our services are provided through private donations from our community. He is a fence climber so he will need a yard with a privacy fence or electric to keep him safe and sound. He will be neutered and vaccinated. 4. **MAGGIE** is a Boxer mix. She had been abandoned and was taken into rescue 7-30-10. On her 1st vet visit she weighed 23 pounds and was estimated to be about 2 years old. Maggie was spayed, vaccinated, and tested heartworm negative on 8-23-10. It is hard to believe in 5 short weeks with a lot of TLC, Maggie now weighs 45 pounds. She is very loving and docile. She has survived all odds against her to become what she is now. She walks well on a leash and comes when called. She seems to be so gracious and humble for having a second chance.



1. **LIZZY** is a female Beagle Mix/Australian Shepherd Mix - Age: About 2 yrs - ID: 42930. Lizzy is a small dog. She is waiting for someone to trust and has a very shy and sweet disposition. 2. **TANNER** is a male Beagle - 3 years - ID: 44322. Owner could no longer care for him. 3. **PETER** is a male Beagle/Pit Bull Terrier - ID: 33667. Peter has been at the animal shelter since January 2009. He is playful and intelligent. 4. **TOTO** is a male Border Terrier/ Terrier - Age: about 2 - ID: 40080. Toto is a little shy and reserved at first, but warms up to people pretty quickly. Needs a family without children.



5. **BILBO** is a male Pit Bull Terrier/Labrador Retriever - 6 months. - ID: 42246. Was one of 7 of a litter of stray puppies. 6. **ALLIE** is a female Pit Bull Terrier - 2 1/2 years old - ID: 42884. Owner could no longer care for her. Good with other dogs and people. 7. **KIDDIE** is a female Shepard Mix - about 1 year old - ID: 43649. Found as a stray 8. **LEANNE** is a Beagle/Rat Terrier - Age: 9 years - ID: 42936. Leanne is an older dog that is very calm and sweet. 9. **ROAD RUNNER** is a female Labrador Retriever/Catahoula Leopard Dog - Age: About 2 years old - ID: 40271. Road Runner has been at the shelter for almost a year. She is ready for a family to love and room to run!
